Barry Bergquist reminisces, "Going to Cloquet High School in the early 1960s was a wonderful experience. I remember the teachers who opened the world to us. Mr. Gus Gillespie was my favorite. His method of telling stories kept me mesmerized. I remember our championship football team under coach Bromberg. And our fantastic basketball team that went to the state tournament. Sports gave our small school a big identity and a source of pride. I enjoyed the dance events: Snoball, Prom and Post Prom. It was a time to socialize with classmates and try the latest dance craze, the Twist. Looking back I realize how easy and carefree life was at that time. When my friend Denny Breitbarth died unexpectedly last year, I wanted to honor him by leaving a legacy that would live on. I chose the Cloquet Educational Foundation because it has a good reputation of helping the youth of our community. It's a large foundation for a town our size and gives to a variety of programs. My classmates suggested we honor all our classmates who have died by establishing the CHS Class of 1963 Memorial Fund.
