

"He was a listener," his mom, Dawn, said. "I try to live each day like he would."

"His determination carried over into doing extraordinary things like Polar Bear Plunges into the icy waters of Lake Superior, or training for grueling marathons. Remarkably, his positive attitude and witty humor always carried him along the way."

It is with the idea of kindness, respect, positive energy and love of life that the Drechsler family has funded the Cole Drechsler Family Fund, in memory of Cole. Dawn, Paul and the Drechsler family hope that Cole's name will remain closely associated with the bright light that still shines in the Cloquet community and inspire many students for years to come.


